Credits Earned in Standardized Examinations

Advanced Placement Examination Program (AP)

The College Entrance Examination Board (CEEB) administers advanced placement examinations that enable high school students to complete college-level courses while still in high school, to demonstrate college-level achievements through examinations, and to receive college course credit when they matriculate at an institution of higher learning. AP credit is only awarded to students who are enrolled in classes at Brightpoint and are curriculum-placed. For evaluation, students must have official AP score reports forwarded from ETS to the Admissions and Records Office at Brightpoint. Effective Jan. 1, 2025, college credit will be awarded for AP examinations as follows:

College-Level Examination Program (CLEP)

Credit for the General Examinations and Subject Examinations of CLEP is awarded subject to the recommendations of the Commission of Educational Credit and Credentials of the American Council on Education (ACE) and the faculty at Brightpoint. CLEP credit is awarded only to students who are enrolled in classes at Brightpoint and who are curriculum-placed and who have submitted official CLEP records to the Admissions and Records Office. All scores below refer to computer-based testing in effect as of February 15, 2003. CLEP examinations taken at Brightpoint do not count toward the 25 percent coursework (see Experiential Learning).

CLEP examinations are administered at Brightpoint by the Testing Center. CLEP examinations are not administered at Brightpoint during the last two weeks of a semester or during the final examination period.

Defense Activity for Non-Traditional Educational Support (DANTES)

Brightpoint awards specific course credit for acceptable scores, as recommended by the American Council on Educations, on DANTES college-level examinations as reported by DANTES. Several types of examinations are reported: end of course examinations for correspondence, extension courses from regionally accredited colleges and universities, College-Level Tests of General Educational Development given prior to 1960, and General Examination of the College-Level Examination Program. Also, college course credits may be granted for tests administered by the United States Armed Forces Institutes (USAFI) prior to June 1, 1974. Scores at the 40th percentile and above are accepted by Brightpoint. Scores at the 20th percentile and above are accepted for DANTES exams taken prior to September 1981. A complete listing of

current and prior tests and recommended scores may be found in ACE's *Guide to Educational Credit by Examination*.
