**Delivery Method – Students may complete the A.S. in General Studies through a variety of means. Each high school offers a unique combination of course options.*

- **DE- JTCC (Dual Enrollment)** - Enrollment in college classes taught at the high school by instructors who meet the credential requirements set forth by the VCCS and/or the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools. Dual credit will be awarded toward this plan for pre-approved courses. A grade of 'C' or higher is expected. Courses shown as offered through DE are available in at least one high school in the John Tyler region.
- **CE-JTCC (Concurrent Enrollment)** - Enrollment in college classes taught by college faculty on campus, via the Internet, as a hybrid, or possibly at the high school. JTCC credit will be awarded toward this plan for pre-approved courses. A grade of 'C' or higher is expected. These courses are taken by high school students entirely at their own expense. Domicile and immigration regulations/deadlines apply. CE-JTCC courses are taken with the permission of the parent, high school principal, and JTCC. All of the requirements can be met through concurrent enrollment at the College.
- **AP (Advanced Placement)** - Credit awarded by JTCC for score of '3' or higher on approved Advanced Placement exam. Students must request that scores be reported to JTCC.
- **IB (International Baccalaureate)** – Credit awarded by JTCC for exam scores – credit varies by score (4&5 or 6&7). Students must request that scores be reported to JTCC. *Students who take AP or IB exams in the senior year will not qualify in time for JTCC spring graduation or the annual Commencement ceremony, but may qualify for August graduation.*

****This course is not required for the A.S. in General Studies, although it satisfies a requirement.** Students should also investigate JTCC's specialized transfer degrees at www.jtcc.edu/academics, such as: AS in Engineering, AS in General Studies- Science Specialization and the AS in Health Sciences/Pre-BSN. Students interested in science, technology, engineering and math (STEM)-related transfer degrees should take MTH 161 or higher to fulfill their math requirement. STEM students should take CHM 111-112 and either PHY 201-202 or PHY 241-242.

******* AP Chinese, German, Italian, Japanese and Latin are also accepted. Students should consult with their intended senior institutions regarding any required levels of foreign language competency (beginning, intermediate, etc.) Students who excel in foreign languages should also investigate the AA in Liberal Arts. Details are available at www.jtcc.edu/academics.

Residency Requirement - Students must earn at least twenty-five percent – 15 college credits - through JTCC Dual and/or Concurrent Enrollment to satisfy the JTCC Residency Requirement. Any modifications to the above pathway will be outlined in writing and agreed upon by JTCC and school division. Any modifications will not prevent students from obtaining the plan's intended credential. All classes are subject to availability.

Each college and university sets its own policies for transfer credit and AP credit. Students must consult with intended four-year colleges/universities (admission and transfer offices, web sites).

Guaranteed Admission and Transfer Agreements

A number of four-year colleges and universities have signed agreements that guarantee admission to JTCC A.S. degree graduates, including those from the UpGrade program. Several institutions prefer that UpGrade students complete the General Education Certificate and enroll at JTCC to complete the A.S. in General Studies in order to qualify for guaranteed admission. Some institutions limit credit that can be earned through AP. Guaranteed admission agreements may specify eligibility for some, but not all majors, and whether this degree satisfies general education requirements for the university and/or major. Students may request possible course substitutions at JTCC to satisfy major requirements for an intended senior institution.
